

### What is preaching?

Teaching from the Bible intended to \_\_\_\_\_ a group of people toward a specific response.

Each sermon should ultimately have \_\_\_\_\_. Everything else is supporting cast.

### What preaching is NOT...

- A \_\_\_\_\_. Information without application.
- Inspirational/Motivational speaking. Good vibes without Biblical truth.
- Entertainment. We're not here to provide a \_\_\_\_\_.
- An \_\_\_\_\_. Be who you are. Prepared, polished, but personal above all else.

### Three questions that preaching should answer:

- What does the Bible \_\_\_\_\_?
- What does it \_\_\_\_\_?
- How do we live this \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_?

### Exegesis vs. Eisegesis

Exegesis: \_\_\_\_\_ one's perspective from Scripture.

Eisegesis: \_\_\_\_\_ one's perspective into Scripture.

We don't look in the Bible to justify our perspective. We search the Scriptures to submit to God's perspective.

### All preaching *must* include:

- Scripture/Explanation of the Scripture. (\_\_\_\_\_)
- Practical example. (\_\_\_\_\_)
- Specific Instruction. (\_\_\_\_\_)
- The "why". (\_\_\_\_\_)

### Different types of preaching:

\_\_\_\_\_. Walking through a single, linear passage of Scripture, gleaning ONE main point, and every supporting point. The sermon begins with the Scripture.

\_\_\_\_\_. Addressing a specific subject and making your ONE main point, and all supporting points connect through multiple passages of scripture. Begins with the subject.

\_\_\_\_\_. An expository sermon that is specifically based in story-telling. Most of the Bible is narrative, so understanding how to tell a story is important.

\_\_\_\_\_ . A hybrid of a expository and topical message, that has a single, shorter passage as the base, but each supporting point is anchored in a different text.
