Things That Have Been

Day 1: Jesus is Enough

Devotional: In our journey through life, we often find ourselves searching for meaning and identity in various places. However, the power of the gospel reminds us that if we have Jesus, we have enough. Colossians 1:13-17 tells us that all things were created by, through, and for Jesus.
